

Editor Australian Community Psychologist Call for Expressions of Interest

The APS is seeking Expressions of Interest for the Editor of the <u>Australian Community Psychologist</u> (ACP), one of the Society's College journals. Previously titled *Network*, the journal has been in continuous publication since 1985.

The ACP is an open access online journal which publishes peer-reviewed work that is of relevance to community psychology researchers and practitioners as well as others interested in the field. In addition to empirical research reports, the journal features contributions that are state of the art reviews of professional and applied areas, and reviews and essays on matters of general relevance to community psychologists.

The Position

The Editor is responsible for implementing the APS' editorial policy, maintaining the publication's reputation, maintaining a panel of appropriately qualified and experienced reviewers, making ultimate decisions regarding acceptance of manuscripts, assuring production standards and timelines are met, and undertaking other editorial responsibilities.

The Editor is responsible for the establishment of, and engagement with, the Editorial Board. The appointee will provide editorial leadership in all matters pertaining to ACP.

The Editor is accountable to the APS Board of Directors via the Periodicals Advisory Committee and the Executive Manager, Science, Education and Membership. The appointee will be eligible to become or be a Member of the College of Community Psychologists, liaise with the College, and be invited to sit on the College's National Committee.

The Editor will be a person with a high-level professional reputation and a strong track record in research, scholarship and publication, with demonstrable experience in editorial roles, including willingness to review manuscripts and providing constructive feedback to authors in a timely fashion. The term of appointment of the editor is up to five years, and the appointment will commence from January 2018.
