

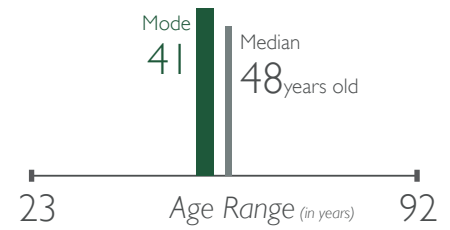
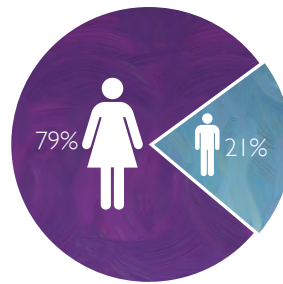

The results of the APS Division of General Psychological Practice (DGPP) Online Survey August 2015

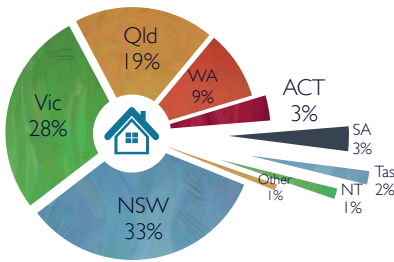


3051 Survey Respondents which is a 25.5% Response of Eligible Members

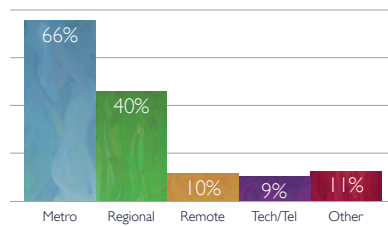
Respondent characteristics largely reflected the general APS membership in gender, age & home locations.



Respondents Home Location

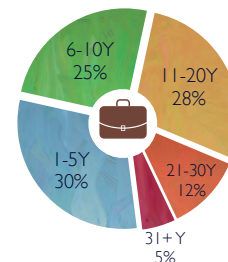


Geographical locations serviced



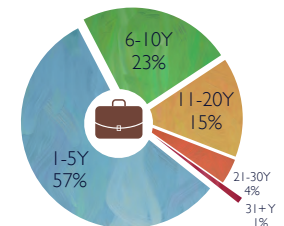
27% span over 2 or more location categories. GPP Psychologists service a higher % of Regional/Remote locations than overall APS.

Years in Full-time work



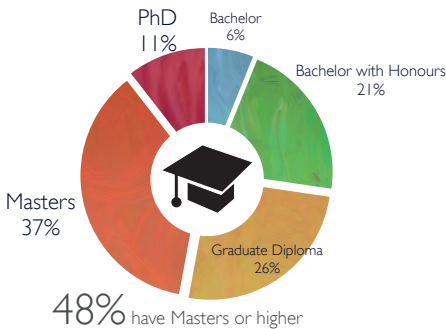
70% worked Full-Time 6+ years, 45% worked Full-Time 11+ years

Years in Part-time work

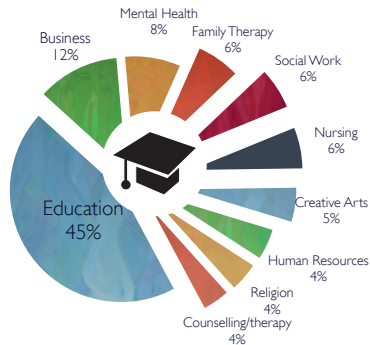

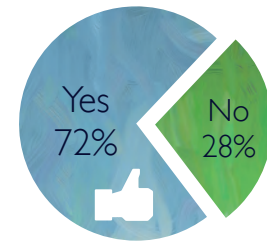
Psychological degrees



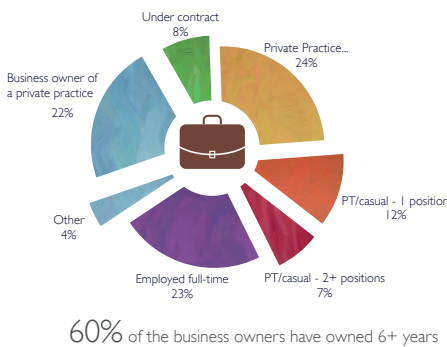

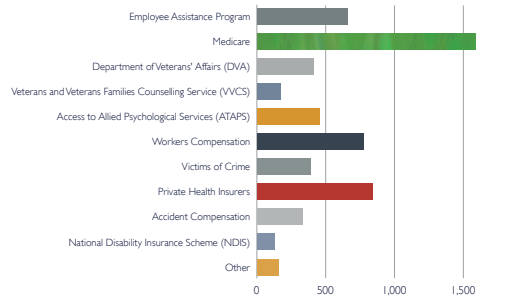
Does your generalist psychology registration and experience qualify you sufficiently for positions that interest you?

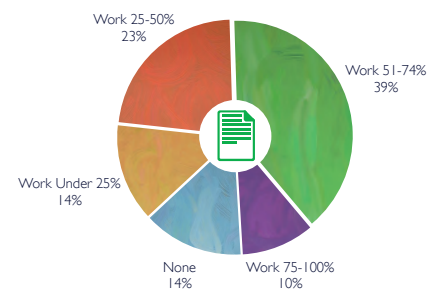

52% of GPP Psychologists are Medicare Providers; with 49% of those saying that more than 50% of their work involves MHCP.

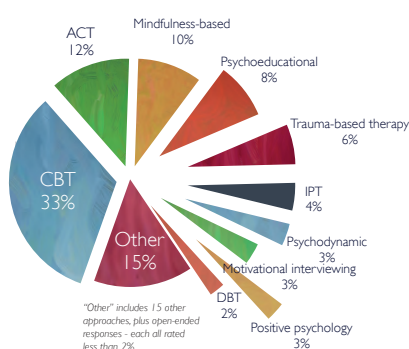
If Medicare provider, how much does is your work MHCP?
