Eleanor Wertheim is a founding member of Psychologists for Peace (originally **Psychologists for the Prevention of War**) and currently its Treasurer, and a member of the Community College. She has been working with Connie Peck (PfP's founder) to educate UN staff and diplomats from around the world about preventive diplomacy and conflict resolution for over 20 years. Through their annual intensive residential programme, more than 700 senior diplomats and staff have now been trained.

Tilman Ruff

Since the 1980s, Tilman Ruff has worked tirelessly to try to rid the world of the threat of nuclear war. Working with the Medical Association for the **Prevention of War and International Physicians for the** Prevention of Nuclear War, he helped found the **International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons** (ICAN). ICAN won the Nobel Peace Prize last year for its success in establishing the UN Treaty on the **Prohibition of Nuclear Weapons. As a founding** member of ICAN, PfP can claim a little piece of 'Alfred', as the medal is fondly known. Tilman hopes to bring a replica 'Alfred' with him when he talks about the road ahead in getting the Treaty ratified.
