Many attractions can be accessed via the Fremantle CAT bus service. The Blue CAT services depart every 10 minutes and the Red CAT services depart every 15 minutes.

5 Fremantle Visitor Centre 🕪

If you can't decide where to start in Fremantle, visit the Fremantle Visitor Centre in the heart of the city: Kings Square. Staff are friendly and well informed about activities and tours available in and around Fremantle.

2 West End Heritage Precinct

The historic architecture of Fremantle makes the West End Heritage Precinct a wonderful place to shop with bookshops, jewellery stores and fashion boutiques.

8 Fremantle Arts Centre 🕅

This historic site was originally the first purpose-built 'lunatic' asylum in WA. It has since been a women's home, a naval base during WW1 and WW2 and a technical college before opening as Fremantle Arts Centre in 1972. Visit the arts centre to see the latest exhibition, stop in at the gift shop or enjoy a coffee in the courtyard café.

Fremantle Markets

Established in 1897, the Fremantle Markets are an eclectic mix of stalls selling everything from souvenirs, craft and fashion to local delicacies and fruit and veggies. The markets are open Friday, Saturday and Sunday (and Monday public holidays) on the corner of South Terrace and the Henderson Street Mall.

3 Fremantle Prison

Don't miss a visit to Fremantle Prison! Several tours are available including torchlight, tunnels and great escapes. Visit the prison café, prison gallery or have a look at the current exhibitions.

Round House - built in 1831

The Round House is the oldest public building in Western Australia. It was originally a local prison and is also the site where the colony's first hanging took place. On the mast behind the building you will find the time ball, erected in 1900 as part of a procedure to give mariners and residents an exact daily time check. It was a visual reference for the I o'clock cannon fire. You can still set your watches by the Ipm firing of the cannon. Be aware – the cannon is loud!

The Western Australian Maritime Museum and (7) Shipwreck Gallery

These attractions are a wonderful way to learn about Western Australia's relationship with the sea and discover how it has been responsible for shaping much of this fascinating state. The Maritime Museum is the home of the controversial yacht, Australia II, that won the Americas Cup through the benefit of its revolutionary winged keel. You can visit the yacht in the museum and walk right up to the keel to contemplate what all of the fuss was about.
