**1) \$1 Billion - Health Reform**. State leaders and Prime Minister John Howard are poised to agree on a \$1 billion national health reform package at Friday's Council of Australian Governments (COAG) meeting.

But Mr. Howard has put the states on notice that he expects them to spend more on mental health, with a coordinated strategy on the agenda for the meeting. <u>www.smh.com.au/national</u>

**2)** Authentic Happiness – Dr Martin Seligman founder of Positive Psychology, a new branch of psychology which focuses on the empirical study of such things as positive emotions, strengths-based character, and healthy institutions. His research has demonstrated that it is possible to be happier — to feel more satisfied, to be more engaged with life, find more meaning, have higher hopes, and probably even laugh and smile more, regardless of one's circumstances. Positive psychology interventions can also lastingly decrease depression symptoms. The research underlying these rigorously tested interventions is presented in the July/August edition of the American Psychologist, the journal of the American Psychology Association.

**3) TheMHS conference.** The Mental health Services conference is on again. <u>The</u> annual TheMHS conference for people associated with mental health issues and psychiatry.

**5) NetAlert – Kidsonline publication.** NetAlert <u>www.netalert.net.au</u> and the <u>Australian</u> <u>Broadcasting Authority</u> recognised a need to capture behaviours and attitudes associated with Internet use in the home, particularly among children aged 8 to 13 years and their parents.

Research was undertaken with the objectives to examine:

- patterns of Internet usage and behaviour
- perceptions of the Internet and online experiences
- strategies for ensuring safety online
- Internet safety information resources and needs
- use of mobile communications

**6) Lifeline - Exploring Loneliness:** The experiences of rural and metropolitan Australia. Insight into the calls received by Lifeline's 24 hour telephone counselling service, with a particular emphasis on rural and regional areas. The purpose of the profiles is to provide insight into population well-being, identify local and regional variations in caller needs and service usage and promote awareness of social trends and changing priorities.
